Arthur Wynne (born 22 June 1871 in Liverpool) is an English player. He moved to the United States when he was 19. He first lived in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and worked for the Pittsburgh Press newspaper. An interesting side note was that Wynne also played the violin in the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. Later, Arthur Wynne moved to Cedar Grove, New Jersey, and began working for a New York newspaper called New York World. He wrote the world's first crossword puzzle in New York, published on Sunday, December 21, 1913. The editor had asked Wynne to come up with a new game for sunday's entertainment section of the magazine. Arthur Wynne's first crossword puzzle was initially called a crossword puzzle and was shaped like a diamond. The name later moved to a crossword, and then, as a result of an accidental typo, the hyphen was dropped and the name crossword. Wynne based his lattices on his lattix, a similar but much older game played in ancient Pompeii, translated from Latin to English, was called Magic Squares. In Magic Squares, a player is given a set of words and must arrange them on the grid so that the words read through and down in the same way. The crossword puzzle is very similar, except that instead of giving the player the words, they are given clues. Arthur Wynne added other innovations to the crossword puzzle. Although the first puzzle was diamond-shaped, he later came up with horizontal and vertical puzzles; And Wynne came up with the idea of adding empty black squares to the crossword puzzle. The british publication's crossword puzzle was published in Pearson's Magazine in February 1922. The first New York Times crossword was published on 1 February 1930. According to the Guinness Book of World Records, the first collection of crossword puzzles was published in the United States in 1924. The Cross Word Puzzle Book was the first release of a new partnership between Dick Simon and Lincoln Schuster. The book, a collection of crossword puzzles from the newspaper New York World, was an instant success and helped found publishing giant Simon & Schuster, which continues to produc crossword books to this day. In 1997, Crossword Weaver patented Variety Games Inc. Crossword Weaver was the first computer software to create crossword puzzles. Puzzles.

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
